ADVERBS

Adverbs describe verbs and they tell us more about how the verb was performed (done). They also make your writing more interesting.

Where to use an adverb...

An adverb can be used next to the verb...

(verb) (Adverb)


Simon ran *quickly* to Peter's house.

or at the beginning of the sentence – this is called a **fronted adverbial**.

(Adverb)

(Verb)

Gently, the mum rocked her baby back to sleep.



Every fronted adverbial word, phrase or clause must be followed by a comma to separate it from the main clause of the sentence.

Look at where the commas are in these sentences:

Slowly, they released the badger back into the wild.

Without a doubt, Billy was going to finish the race in first place.

On Tuesday, I am going on holiday!
