





# Writing

## Day 1

Read the preface on page 9.

Hubert and his family live in a mansion called *Sweeping Acres*.

An acre is an old unit used to measure an area of land.

What does 'mansion' mean and what does *Sweeping Acres* suggest?

Using the photos of the inside and outside of grand houses, create a mind map with all of your ideas and then write a descriptive paragraph explaining what life at *Sweeping Acres* could be like in 'care-free' times.

## Day 3

Writing fluency – Using the image of the abandoned mill write a descriptive paragraph.

Do your work the same way we do in class.

- Organise your sentences into a paragraph that flows and makes sense.
- Edit and improve your writing

## Concrete and abstract nouns

**Concrete nouns** are **physical things** that you can either see, touch, taste, hear or smell.

In other words, they can be experienced through the five senses.

For example: sweets, television, cardboard, sunshine, candle, piano.

**Abstract nouns** are things that don't have a physical form, you can't touch them, but are still **things**.

Abstract nouns might be concepts, ideas, or emotions.

For example: knowledge, intelligence, friendship, kindness, betrayal.
