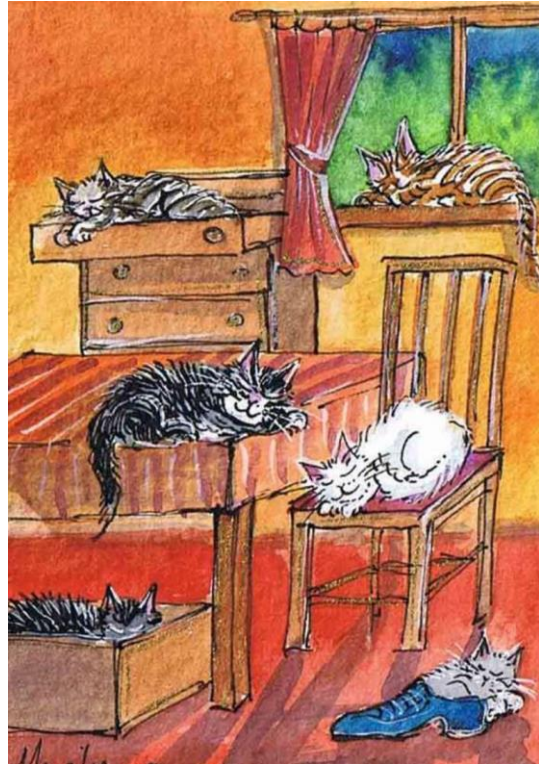





Title: Cats
