Provide specialist teaching in maths to accelerate progress for those who should be working at Greater Depth and smaller teaching groups to address those falling behind age-related expectations	<p>Maths progress accelerated in Y6 and those on track for greater depth in maths exceeded those for whom this was their KS1 target.</p> <p>Specialist teaching in Y5 has ensured that children now entering Y6 have recovered more learning gaps than those in other year groups.</p>
Equip and resource the school library with texts to engage readers and increase Reading for Pleasure	<p>Bibliotheca is drawing a range of pupils into read and engage with texts due to the quality of texts selected and the front facing shelving.</p> <p>Focus will now move to classroom libraries</p>

Establishing a PEO workspace to provide an appropriate space for supporting pupil welfare and family engagement.	Parental engagement with the PEO is high and due to the design of the space was safe to use during the pandemic, which enable the school to still support the most vulnerable
Part funding a Pupil Engagement Officer to support attendance and acute need.	PEO is a well-establish role. Due to how she was able to engage with families during the pandemic and the range of support she offered, the role is now well-established.
