
- Pre-school and YR will be visiting the Junior School to meet Poppels Barn Farm

Southampton Boat show Trip

"I really liked seeing HRH Princess Anne . We saw her twice while she walking around the Boat Show. She looked very smart in her suit and it was interesting to see a member of the Royal family in real life. It was a once in a lifetime experience. We learned about what people wore when exploring the Arctic including protective clothes and glasses with a special cross shaped hole to stop them from getting snow blind. We did an experiment to see what worked best to defend land against the waves. We used sea grass meadows to stop the waves and they used a wave machine to test it. We found out the seagrass was very effective at slowing down the waves. It is a really good natural flood defence." **David, 5M**

"It was a really amazing experience. We got to do lots of activites and it was really fun. We saw lots of boats. We learned about safety in the water as well as chemicals in the ocean and rivers. We tested the water with a PH test in a science experiment. The University of Southampton showed us when the first people went to the Arctic and we used VR to experience what that was like." "I really liked going on the trip because I saw lots of places for real that I saw on the map." - Hoorain, Y1








"I really enjoyed going on the trip because I saw lots of buildings on the way." - Shokria, Y1
